Army Procedures and Protocol Act 2021

2021 CHAPTER 1

An act to formerly create drill procedures and outline the articles of protocol for His Majesty's Army. [7^h January 2020]

BE IT ENACTED by the King's ruling, with the advice and consent of the Privy Council, in this present government assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. Drill Procedures

- (1) His Majesty's Army must be able to conduct a drill, act under pressure, and show a high level of professionalism at all times. If this motion is violated, the member may be honorably discharged from active service.
- (2) Right/Left Face is defined as soldiers turning to the right/left respectively.
- (3) About Face is defined as soldiers turning around over the right shoulder.
- (4) Right/Left Incline is defined as soldiers doing a half turn to the right/left respectively.
- (5) Dress Right/Left is defined as soldiers being six inches apart (about an arm's length) from the soldier to their right/left and will make the line parallel.
- (6) Ready Front (Cover) is defined as soldiers stopping their movement; Once the command "Cover" is given, soldiers will make any final adjustments to their movement.
- (7) Attention is defined as soldiers not speaking nor moving, and their arms being along the seams of their pants.
- (8) Stand at Ease is defined as the soldiers not speaking nor moving, and their hands behind their backs; right over left hand, fingers extended.
- (9) Stand Easy is defined as the soldiers standing at ease, however having the ability to pivot.
- (10) Dismissed is defined as soldiers taking one step back, salute, making a right turn, and to march off.

- (11) Forwards March is defined as soldiers one by one will march forward following their drill commander's lead.
- (12) Halt is defined as soldiers halting where they are and will not dress the line if they're not caught up; They will only dress it and ordered to.
- (13) Present Arms is defined as soldiers using the "salute" position.
- (14) Order Arms is defined as soldiers putting their arms down.

2. Protocol

- (1) Every person who will not observe, acknowledge, or follow the orders of his or her superior officer, or refuses to honor an officer or superior by the use of the titles "Sir" or "Ma'am", or in the specific case of an NCO, by their rank proper; shall be court martialed.
- (2) Any person who, upon any pretense whatsoever, assumes the rank or wears the uniform of a rank superior to the one currently held for the purposes of misleading, corrupting, or otherwise disrupting the judgment of others is considered illegal. All persons so offending and being convicted thereof shall by sentence be court martialed.
- (3) If any officer or soldier in or belonging to His Majesty's Army shall through cowardice or negligence refuse to fight any enemy shall be illegal and thereof be convicted by sentence of court martialed.
- (4) If any officer or soldier in His Majesty's Army shall render their self, their squad, battalion, regiment, or otherwise, sword, or command to any enemy under any pretense or for any reason whatsoever, all persons so offending and being convicted thereof by sentence of court martialed.
- (5) If any officer or soldier in His Majesty's Army shall strike, attempt to strike, entice others to do so, or threaten their lawful superior, their action is considered illegal. all persons so offending and being convicted thereof by sentence of court martialed.
- (6) If any officer or soldier shall desert or entice others to do so, all persons so offending and being convicted thereof by sentence of court martialed.
- (7) If any officer or soldier in His Majesty's Army shall make, endeavor to make, or conceal any mutinous designs or assemblies upon any pretense whatsoever, all persons so offending being convicted by sentence of court martialed.
- (8) Any officer or soldier of His Majesty's Army being accused beyond reasonable doubt of aiding the enemy by the use of espionage, sabotage, or other malicious acts is considered illegal. All persons so offending and being convicted thereof by sentence of court martial.
- (9) If any person in His Majesty's Army should attempt to cause a quarrel between themselves and a member of equal or lower rank, all persons so offending and being convicted thereof by sentence of court martial shall find themselves liable to demotion.
- (10) If any person in His Majesty's Army shall negligently perform the duty imposed upon themselves, all persons so offending and being convicted thereof by sentence of court martial shall find themselves liable to demotion.

- (11) No officer or soldier of His Majesty's Army shall refuse to accept the surrender or parole of defeated enemies, unless those enemies are suspected (beyond reasonable doubt) of espionage. Refusal to do so will result in demotion, or such less punishment as a court of inquiry sees fit to impose.
- (12) If any person of any rank shall be convicted by sentence of court martial of discrimination based on age, gender, orientation, mental efficacy, disability, race, religion, or origin, all persons so offending and being convicted thereof by sentence of court martial shall be dishonorably dismissed from His Majesty's Service.
- (13) All other crimes not capital committed by any person or persons in the Army, which are not mentioned in this act, or for which no punishment is directed to be inflicted, shall be handled by the laws and customs used by local courts, or subject to His Majesty.
